Facilitator Guide

Preparing for the Workshop:

The purpose of the second session will be to discuss the results of the Jung Typology Test. Students will begin making connections between careers they are familiar with and careers that are unfamiliar. In doing so, their knowledge base will be expanded to include potentially new careers of interest.

Facilitator expectation	Student participation
<p>Hand out worksheet “Career Indicator.” Have students begin filling out the information as requested.</p> <p>If student did not complete the Jung Typology Test, instruct to complete and bring to the next session.</p>	
<p>Column 1: Careers that match personality according to Jung Typology</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will fill out Column 1 of the “Career Indicator” handout with careers that match personality types
<p>Column 2: What student knows about career</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students begin to fill out Column 2 using the knowledge they have regarding a particular career
<p>Column 3: Information student researches about career</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will research each career they know little to nothing about
<p>Discuss the importance of knowing the various careers that match interest, personality, and values.</p> <p>Emphasize that students may not know how interesting a career is until they experience it in some manner. For instance, an ENFP is suitable for a career in Fitness & Nutrition – there are not many people who readily think of this field as a career, but it fits the personality.</p>
